The Educational Enrichment Foundation was established in 1983 through a grant from the Ford Foundation, and is an independent non-profit organization offering programs in support of children and staff in the Tucson Unified School District. Currently, a board of sixteen directors governs EEF, consisting of educators and community members. The mission of EEF is to provide resources to expand and enrich student learning in the Tucson Unified School District (TUSD). EEF provides these resources through the following programs: 1) Special Needs Program that provides resources for basic needs, incuding clothing, shoes and eye care for students living in poverty to be able to enter the classroom prepared to learn; 2) Classroom Grants to Teachers for innovative and creative classroom projects; and 3) Scholarships to students for athletic and fine arts participation fees and post-secondary studies.
